**Course Description:** The Adult Roles and Financial Responsibilities is a year class designed to help high school students make the transition to independent living. Class activities and guest speakers will cover the topics of relationships, communication, dating, marriage preparation, and parenting as well as money and time management. Every topic is covered with a strong emphasis on responsible decision-making.

**Parental Permission:** Because this class covers topics identified by Utah State law as needing parental consent, please read and sign the attached sheet. Students will not be allowed to participate in class discussions or activities on those subjects without a signed permission paper on file.

**Grading:** Grades are determined on various criteria and they are outlined as follows:

## Assignments:

1. Assignments not turned in on the due date or before 8:00 the next morning can earn a maximum of 50% of the total points possible.

3. There will be no make-up work for unexcused absences.
4. You are responsible to check on missed assignments when absent. All make-up work must be turned in within one week from the date you return to school.
5. Quizzes may be given at the beginning of class and cannot be made up if you are tardy.
6. Any work missed when students are sent to the office for disciplinary reasons, cannot be made up.

Participation: Class discussions will be a regular part of this class. You will be given points for your participation in these discussions. You should be prepared to make comments and state your opinion on the given topic.

#### Class Rules:

1. Be prepared for class with the necessary materials.
2. There will be no profanity or obscene gestures in class
3. Demonstrate care and respect for class property. Clean up after yourself. Act like an adult and you will be treated like one.
4. Threatening, coercing, intimidating, or annoying any other students or staff will not be tolerated. If you threaten or make fun of another student you will be required to leave class and will not be allowed to return until you have a signed letter from both a guardian, and an administrator.
5. No food or drinks in classroom.
6. Students must have a hall pass to leave class.

#### Citizenship and Attendance Policy

Students should be present in class everyday to complete assignments and participate in class discussions. Students will be marked tardy if they are not in their seats when the tardy bell rings. School and district policies will be enforced.

#### Dress Code

This class follows the Nebo and SHS dress code. Students will not be allowed to remain in class if they arrive dressed inappropriately.

#### Supplies

You will need a three ring binder to keep journal entries, assignments, and hand-outs in order. You should bring additional paper and a writing utensil to every class.

#### Term Project

Each student will complete a term project that has been approved by the teacher.

Extra Credit: After all required projects have been completed; students may earn extra credit by completing additional projects as instructed by the teacher. Up to 100 extra credit points may be earned.
